



**Forest Park, Anheuser Busch and Ted Drewes Tour**

*This itinerary includes an overview of Forest Park with a choice of stops at the History Museum or the Art Museum, a brief tour of Union Station with time for lunch on own, a tour of the Anheuser-Busch Brewery and a visit to Ted Drewes Frozen Custard.*

“Meet Me in St. Louis” at Forest Park—the site of the 1904 World’s Fair and one of the largest city parks in the United States. Today, Forest Park is home to the world-renowned Saint Louis Zoo, the Saint Louis Art Museum, the History Museum at Jefferson Memorial, the Science Center and the Muny, the largest outdoor theater in the country, among other attractions.

Enjoy an opportunity to spend some today at either the History Museum or the St. Louis Art Museum. At the History Museum travel back in time to explore the history of St. Louis from 1764 to the present, including the early days of aviation with Charles Lindbergh’s historic transatlantic flight and a special exhibit honoring the history of the 1904 World’s Fair, the “World’s Greatest Fair.” The Saint Louis Art Museum offers something for every art lover from modern art to the Renaissance. With something exciting around every turn, you’ll see why it is considered one of the top ten art museums in the country.

You will also visit St. Louis Union Station where your tour guide will give an overview of the Grand Hall. Once the busiest rail terminal in the world, the Grand Hall and Train Shed have been magnificently renovated to house specialty stores, festive markets and a hotel. Enjoy free time for lunch on your own at Union Station.

Following lunch your Destination St. Louis tour guide will familiarize you with the rich history of the colorful Busch family en route to the King of Beers—the Anheuser-Busch Brewery. Situated in a complex with over 70 red brick structures on 100 acres, the brewery buildings are known for their unique architecture and several are National Historic Landmarks.

During the tour, you will see the World Famous Clydesdales, the Fermentation Building, the Packaging and Bottling Plant, the Brew House and a film about the brewing process. No visit would be complete without a stop in the hospitality room to sample the family of Anheuser-Busch products.

After leaving Anheuser-Busch you’re in for one last treat. Before returning to the hotel, savor a sweet treat as you stop at Ted Drewes Frozen Custard, a St. Louis tradition since 1929. Here enjoy a specialty “concrete” shake that is so thick you can turn it upside down.
